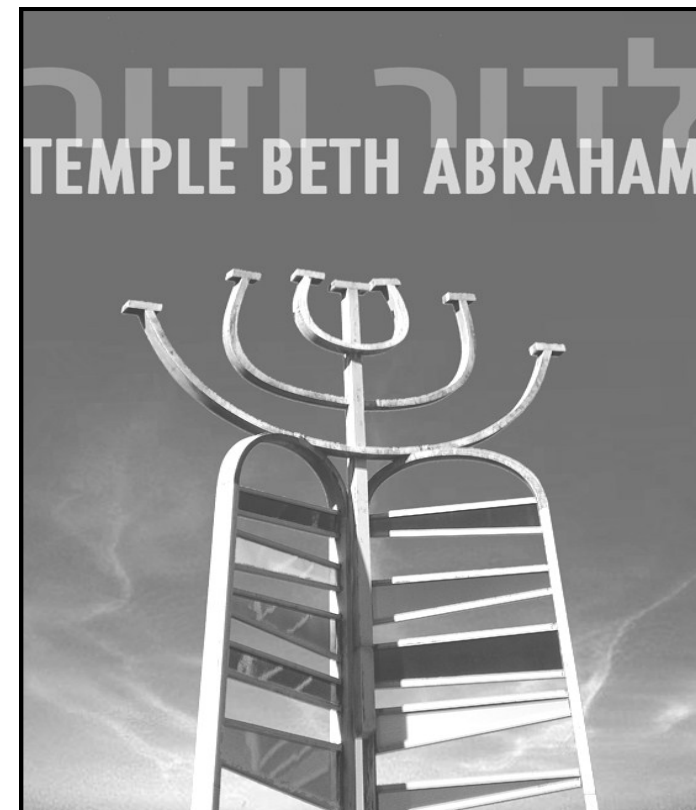

**Temple Beth Abraham's
Chavurah Program**



CHAVURAH (chav-yuh-rah)
pl. chavurot; from the Hebrew
word "chaver" meaning
1. group of friends
2. a Jewish fellowship;
especially an informal
one that meets regularly.

A chavurah at TBA is a group of TBA members with common interests and/or demographics who are assembled in groups of 5-9 families. They get together about once a month on their own schedule for activities in or outside of TBA which are of interest to them.

The chavurah program now has 35 families involved in 5 ongoing groups:

- 2 family groups and 1 adult group which are filled to capacity.
- 1 family group that has room for 1-2 more families (kids 9-15).
- 1 adult group made up of parents of college aged or just post-college aged children, which has room for several more parents.

In addition to those groups we are looking specifically for:

1. Single moms with their families to complete a family chavurah that is nearly ready to launch
2. Single parents interested in an adult group
3. A women's group (single or not)
4. A men's group (single or not)
5. Young families with babies or toddlers

All registration forms and group ideas are welcome. These groups happen to be in the process of being formed, but any groups can be formed at any time if there is enough interest.

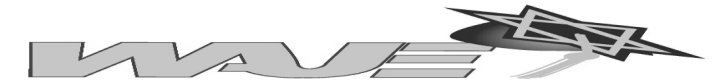

A CONVERSATION WITH RABBI URI REGEV**

He is the founder and president of *Hiddush*, an Israeli organization whose mission is to realize Israel's founding vision as articulated in its Declaration of Independence.

Rabbi Regev, an Israeli attorney ordained at HUC-JIR Jerusalem, served as founding chair, executive chair, and legal counsel of the Israel Religious Action Center. Through that and various other organizations he has been an Israeli voice for pluralistic Judaism and an advocate for human rights. He has taken on Israeli Supreme Court cases involving "Who is a Jew?" equitable funding for Reform and Conservative institutions, and the fight for representation in religious counsels. Calling on his usual passion, dynamism and remarkable facility with words, Rabbi Regev will discuss the current status of religious pluralism in Israel.
