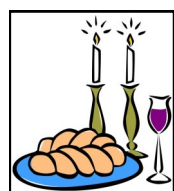

Save the dates for this year's Shabbaton weekend at Camp KinderRing in Sylvan Lake, NY.

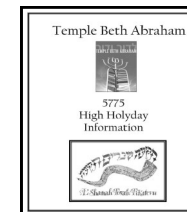

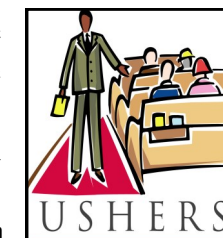
