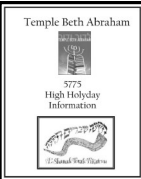

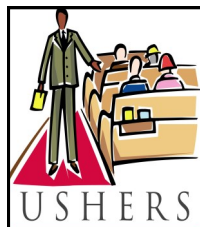

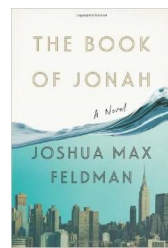
Interested in Volunteering as a High Holyday Usher?
