The Flowers on the Bima is sponsored by Temple Beth Abraham.

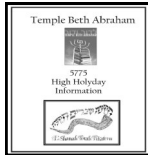

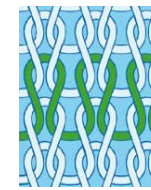
**An Evening of Events on *Selichot*—
