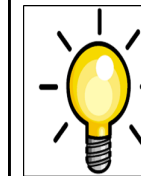


**Women's Circle—Friday, May 29, 5:45pm**

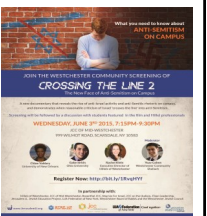
