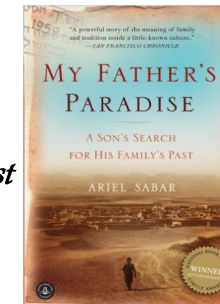

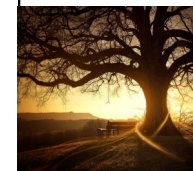
The Next Book Club Discussion:
