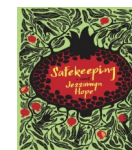

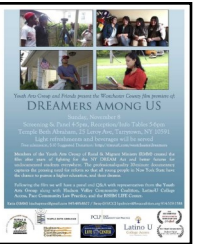
**The Next TBA Book Club Discussion
