Movie Mavens Presents: *Live and Become (Va, Vis et Deviens)*

THIS Saturday, March 19 at 7:00pm

In 1980 the black *Falashas* in Ethiopia are recognized as genuine Jews. Because they are Jews, they are transported out of Sudanese refugee camps into Israel during Operation Moses. A young Christian Ethiopian boy is sent by his mother on a transport posing as the son of a Jewish mother whose own son has died. She tells him to "Go, live and become." Once in Israel his Jewish mother dies and a French-Israeli family adopts him. This is the epic story of his struggle to understand and come to terms with politics, race, and family while keeping two big secrets - he is neither a Jew nor an orphan. Hebrew, French, and Amharic with English subtitles.
