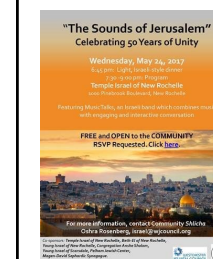
Israel Day Parade on Sunday, June 4
