Temple Beth Abraham's mission is to provide our congregants with opportunities to create meaningful connections to God, Torah, the Jewish People and the surrounding Community.





**A Statement on Immigration**



“The Jewish tradition makes clear that welcoming the stranger and protecting the vulnerable are of paramount importance. Taking children away from their families as a way of deterring illegal immigration is immoral and against the best traditions of the American republic...We now call on our own communities to stand up alongside us in demanding such action and we pray that God will ease the pain of those who have suffered under the weight of “Zero Tolerance.” We hope for a more kind and humane policy in the days ahead.”
