Saturday, June 22 at 6:00pm

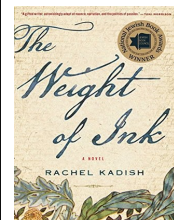
Please join us for a sports-centric American-Israeli dinner followed by the film, "On the Map."
