Our building project is moving forward, albeit at a slower pace than we anticipated. We made our initial presentation before the Tarrytown Planning Board on February 24. We continue to work with our architects, professional engineers, and legal advisers to resolve as many issues as possible as we prepare for our next meeting with the Planning Board on March 23.

Once we have all of the approvals and permits needed from the town, construction will begin and it's anticipated that the project should be completed in approximately 9 months. Religious services and Temple programs will continue throughout. And of course no construction will take place during Shabbat or on the High Holydays.

We will announce a date for an informational meeting to review our plans for this project and a Q&A will follow.

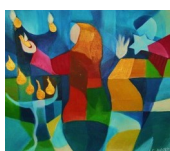
